FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS (FAQ)**

**Q: To whom should our grant application be sent?**

A: The electronic application form should be completed and submitted together with an uploaded copy of the grant proposal via [RBFF.org](http://RBFF.org).

**Q: How do you define underserved?**

A: Underserved includes, but is not limited to, low and moderate income persons (generally defined as a member of a family having an income equal to or less than the Section 8 low income limit established by the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development, individuals with limited English proficiency, individuals from historically underserved areas both rural and/or urban and individuals with a mental or physical disability). Underserved also includes disadvantaged individuals, individuals with limited English proficiency and individuals from underserved geographic areas (rural or urban).

**Q: What is the status of our application?**

A: If you have received an e-mail confirmation of receipt from RBFF and no other correspondence, your application remains under review.

**Q: How many copies of the application should be submitted?**

A: Please submit two (2) hard copies and one (1) electronic copy. Please do not enclose the proposal in any type of cover or binder.

**Q: Are matching funds required, and if so, how much?**

A: Matching funds are not required.

**Q: Our project didn't receive funding in the past. May we resubmit an application?**

A: Your organization may submit a new application if the proposal has changed significantly or if your organization is proposing a new project.

**Q: When will we be notified of a funding decision?**

A: Applicants will be notified of grant award or denial by letter in April 2011.
